


Thank you for wanting to help make and scatter Peyton Heart Project hearts in your area.

The hearts you make should be about 2 inches by 2.5 inches (5cm-6cm) in size with **two** strands of 5 inches (12cm) each coming from the **center of the top** of the hearts that you tie together into an overhand or figure eight knot (not a granny knot or square knot) before you attach the tags. Please do not make this loop long enough for a child to wear as a necklace. A child could become entangled in it. If you are unable to print the tag file, please still tie a knot with the two strands of yarn and clip the tail ends evenly.

The hearts should be bright colors – not solid black. **Please do not attach buttons, beads, etc. to the hearts because a small child might find the heart and it could present a choking hazard.**

Below are the fronts and backs of the tags for the Crisis Hotline Numbers in the U.S. only. They are to be used only as a second tag, placed behind the quote tags for the Peyton Heart Project.

If your printer does automatic double-sided printing: set it to print pages 2 to 3. If your printer doesn't print both sides by itself: set it to print the front pages (2) then turn them over and run them through the printer again printing page 3 on the backs. Make sure the same edge is up on both sides.

Use a hole punch to place a hole in the upper LEFT corner of the front of each tag:  Then, attach these tags with the quote tags to the hearts. Please use brightly colored card stock for our quote tags and white card stock for these crisis tags. Only use thick paper to print out the tags please. At least **"65lb"** weight card stock. Regular 20-24lb copy paper is just not strong enough.

Have fun and please take some photos along the way. Be sure to share them on our Facebook page or Instagram/Twitter. Be sure to mention that you are scattering the hearts when you post the photos. When posting on social media please add the hashtag #PeytonHeartProject to your photos.
